

Five Things to Do Before Your Social Security Hearing





1. Be honest and thorough when you tell SSA why you're disabled. Explain **all** of your limitations both physical and mental.



2. Make sure all relevant and current medical records are in your file at SSA. (We do this for all of our clients).



3. Complete and return all forms to SSA in a timely manner.



4. Continue to get medical treatment even if the doctors have told you there isn't much they can do for you. Documentation is vital.



5. Get an opinion in writing from your doctor about all of the limitations you have that SSA considers important for determining disability.

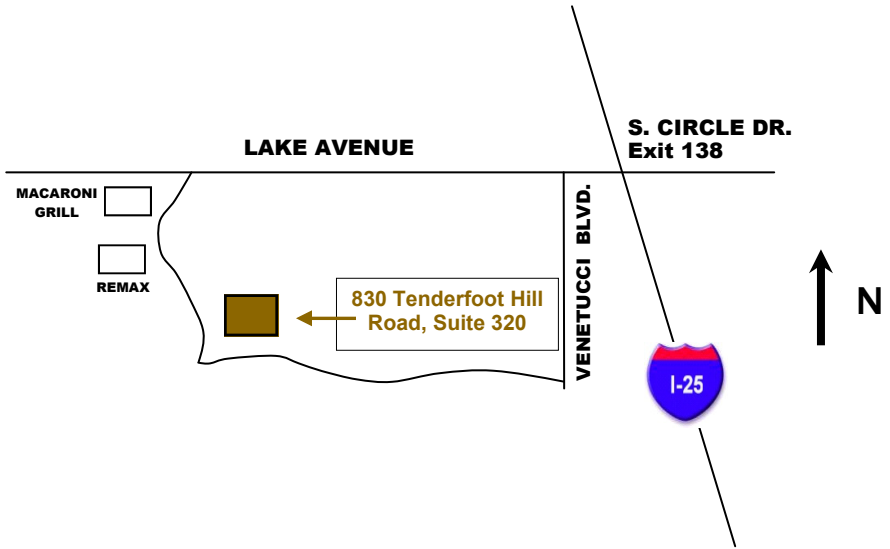
